The ANIM has been growing over the last 40 years and has focused both on all aspects of neurological and neurosurgical critical care as well as neurological emergency medicine. With more than 1000 participants each year, the conference is one of the largest neurocritical care conferences worldwide.

What will be new at the ANIM in 2027?

We wish to open our meeting to the international audience and have a dialogue and share our knowledge as each nurse possesses valuable insights and expertise from their experiences in neurocritical care. We hope for this to be an open and active discussion, so we may all learn from each other as to what care approaches have been beneficial and effective for patients and understand how care practices are conducted across the borders.
